A Note from the Stewards What's It Worth ?

Any great organization or company has at its head paid leaders. These people could be the company's CEO, Vice-President, or Managers. However, few companies or businesses could be successful if only these persons did all the work. Company workers who follow the lead of these execs are the backbone of a thriving business.

In our church, we have a number of paid individuals who give direction and expertise in directing our church mission: To Continue the Work of Jesus, Peacefully, Simply, Together. The number of our unpaid church workers far exceed those who are paid. Our church simply could not function, financially or otherwise, without these volunteers.

Consider two examples. First, last year a team of 345 BDM workers spent 2,614 workdays in Waverly, Tennessee helping that community recover from a flood event. The value of their service amounted to \$ 626,314.00. Just last month, our annual work / clean the church day had more than 30 volunteers on that one day. Many more are planning to add to that number in weeks to come in order to complete the assigned tasks. What's it worth? What would be the service value if they all were paid even the minimum wage? The answer is: Priceless. ALL our workers deserve a big Thank You.
