FROM THE PASTOR

"If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith."

- 1 Corinthians 15:14

What we believe about the resurrection is crucial to our faith. Resurrection says that death does not have the final word. Evil does not have the final word. Injustice does not have the final word. Resurrection means that we worship a savior who died but was raised to life again and is still living. Paul explains in a number of his letters that the same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in you and in me! That's resurrection. That's our hope and faith.

Yet if we are honest with each other, it's a stretch! At least it was for Mary and the disciples that day. What I absolutely love about the resurrection accounts is how each person handles it differently and how regardless of their initial reaction, Jesus continues to appear in their lives until they finally get it.

Take Peter for example... Peter walks into the tomb.... Looks around and sees that Jesus isn't there. He sees the grave clothes folded up on a bench and he even notices that the head shroud is folded up separately and laying on the bench next to the other clothes. And then...he goes home, seemingly unaffected by the whole thing.

But don't worry about Peter... he'll meet Jesus again on the beach and finally get it.

And then there's the "other disciple". He walks in, sees the exact same thing as Peter did...only he believes. But believes what? Mary's story? Because John goes on to say:

"They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead."

- John 20:9

Other disciples will eventually get it later in John when Jesus walks through the door and shows them the holes in his hands and feet...

Then there's Mary. It's almost comical. There she is chatting it up with two angels when Jesus appears and asks her why she's crying. Her reaction? She thinks he's the gardener. And she goes on to tell Jesus the whole story of how he died and how someone stole the body and so on.

Isn't it good to know that Jesus meets us where we are, pursues us until we get it? I wonder how many of us have met Jesus along the way and didn't recognize him or chatted with angels not knowing it?

Larry Simmons opened the meeting with prayer.

Chair of the Trustees, Scott Shomo updated the Board of the work regarding the loan for the HVAC project. Five local banks were asked for quotes for the loan. The best quote for the project was City Bank and steps will be taken to secure the loan. The Trustees are asking that the church get a financial review, with an agreed upon procedure with an accountant. According to the Constitution, this should happen during the first quarter, but we are asking that it be done by May. The Stewards will oversee this process.

Chandra Lane, Chair of the Search Committee for Associate Pastor reviewed the actions of the committee. The Search Committee followed the guidelines from the Shenandoah District in regards to securing an Associate Pastor and recommend to the Board that we call Pastor Rebecca House for a trial sermon and vote on April 21, 2024. On April 20th, Pastor House will have a meet and greet with the children of the church from 3-4 p.m. and the youth from 5-7 p.m.

On Sunday, April 21st, there will be coffee time/brunch during the Sunday school hour, followed by her trial sermon.

A motion was made by Nancy Bowman, seconded by Candy Smith that we are in favor of the call of Rebecca House to our Associate Pastor role, and to have a trial sermon and meet and greet weekend with the congregation on April 20-21. After the trial sermon, the congregation will vote on the candidate and the terms of the call. Vote passed.

Upcoming meetings: The board meeting scheduled for April will be cancelled due to the called meeting in March. The executive committee will meet on April 9. There will be a called Congregational Business Meeting following worship service on the April 21st.

The Spring Congregational Business Meeting scheduled for April 28, 2024 will be delayed due to recent activities.

Money that has come in for the Air Conditioning fund will be rolled over into the HVAC fund.

DISASTER AUCTION - GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Shenandoah District Disaster Auction is scheduled for the weekend of May 17-18. The auction opening golf tournament is scheduled for 8:30 a.m., Friday, May 17 at the Heritage Oaks course in Harrisonburg. In response to feedback, we've made some changes to registration fees for golfers. Sponsor fees remain as in previous years.

As usual, the success of our tournament is dependent upon attracting both players and sponsors. Our faithful partners of the past have enabled us to provide significant resources so that those suffering natural or man made disasters experience a better chance at restoring their lives. District volunteers were able to travel to Dawson Springs, Kentucky to work in cooperation with Habitat for Humanity to restore lives. Our own volunteers were there in the fall. Dawson Springs was hard-hit by tornadoes 2 weeks prior to Christmas 2021. Brethren Disaster Ministries reported the Kentucky Governor was able to hand out 5 sets of keys to new homes based on Habitat and BDM work there last year. But the work goes on into 2024.

All past players and sponsors are being contacted to renew their support of BDM through the Shenandoah District Disaster Auction. But we know we will lose some so there is **room** and **need** for new **players** and **sponsors**. Please contact Larry Simmons or Bob Armbruster to see how you can help. Through your financial support you can be 'Jesus in the Neighborhood' without driving a single ball.

RECYCLING OPPORTUNITIES
